

NONRESIDENT NONTAXPAYER LIBRARY CARDS

Nonresident cards will be issued for a fee to persons residing outside the boundaries of and not paying property taxes to the Grayslake Area Public Library District if the Grayslake Library is the public library closest to their principal residence. This is determined by the location of libraries in the following governmental territories, in sequential order, in which the non-resident has his or her principal residence:

1. High School or Consolidated School District
2. Township
3. County

A list of acceptable forms of identification is available online and at the Circulation Desk.

Applicants must present any combination of pieces of identification needed to include the following:

- One photo ID showing their photo and name
- One piece of identification showing their name and signature
- Two pieces of identification showing their name and current address

The simplest combination of these is a Drivers License or State ID and one other form of identification showing their current address, matching the address on the Drivers License or State ID.

Only one fee per household will be charged and cards will be issued to all members of the household on the same basis resident cards are issued.

A patron shall use only their own resident library card for their own library transactions including but not limited to circulation functions, program registration and other library services. Patrons may give permission for others to access their account – please refer to Policy 337, PATRONS ALLOWING OTHERS TO ACCESS THEIR LIBRARY ACCOUNTS.

Parents or legal guardians of children under high school age must sign the child’s application.

The card will be issued for a period of one year for a fee based on the per-capita support for the library per household and may be renewed upon verification of continued residency. Verification requires presentation of their library card and one piece of identification or any combination of pieces of identification needed to include the following:

- One photo ID showing their photo and name
- One piece of identification showing their name and signature
- One piece of identification showing their name and current address, matching the address on record in their library card account

The simplest combination of these is a Drivers License or State ID.

If the address provided does not match the address on record in their library card account, a second form of identification proving the new address must be presented.

Nonresident cards shall allow for full reciprocal borrowing privileges at all participating public libraries.
